Preamble:

Various studies of Prakrit language indicate it as one of the oldest and most popular laymen's language of ancient India during early pre-Christian centuries. There is a big treasure of literature available up to 200 A.D. to 1200 A.D in various prakrit languages, which introduce us with ancient history, culture and, tradition. Prakrit language can be interpreted as the natural language of the masses. We get Prakrit language development with many names, viz, Maharashtri, Magadhi, Ardhamagadhi, Paishachi, Pali, Shauraseni, Maharashtri and Apabhramsha.

Mahavira and Buddha popularized it through their sermons and consequently it became a literary language. The major subject matter of this work is related with Prakrit canonical literature spread over many centuries.
